Winter Care

Well as we know Winter is upon us, (yes stating the obvious) and hopefully we have all given special attention to our babies preparing them for the next couple of months of cold frosty weather. Below you will find a list of 'Have we done yets' to maybe help to remind us of some of the jobs that might need doing to provide protection for our orchids during this time.

HAVE YOU DONE (Please note this is a general guide only and not specific to all orchids or limited to.)

- 1. Put the water proof cover on the shadehouse (extra protection from excessive water)
- 2. Removed the extra layer of shadecloth (providing more light through winter)
- 3. Got the fan circulating air (helps with those cold misty/foggy mornings)
- 4. Changed to morning watering (plants not wet during the night and freezing)
- 5. Turned your heaters on in hothouses.
- 6. Reduced your watering and fertilizing, and for some ceased watering all together.
- 7. Keeping your eyes out for those dreaded fungal or bacterial problems that can present themselves more in winter.

Another thing on our list is LOOKING FOR FLOWER SPIKES, there is nothing more exciting than taking the usual wander around the shadehouse and finding that pleasant surprise......'Oh look, another orchid with a flower spike' especially if it is one you haven't flowered yet.

For the novice growers who aren't sure what to do with their particular orchid during winter, please don't hesitate to contact another member of the club for advice. If in doubt don't be scared to ask, as there really are no silly questions.

Each season brings us all something new and different flowering in our shade/hot houses, we are so lucky here to be able to grow such a diverse range of orchids, and winter is no exception.

Conference Plant Labels

Your Pot Number: Enter your pot number for each plant entered (so we know who it belongs to) If you have 2 or more of the same plant you must enter each and every plant on a separate line in the spreadsheet <u>and not entered</u> as 2 x whatever. As every plant will be allocated a unique number.

Include the Class: Enter the Class from the Show Schedule that your plant will be in please Your best estimate will do as this assists in allocating room for your plants

Plant name: Please enter your plants in the format as below.

It is your responsibility to take the time to check and ensure you have the correct genus, spelling and format. Please ensure all species are entered in lowercase as below

Species as: Phal. tetraspis 'Best Orchid'

Hybrid as: Den. Australian Artist 'Something Special'

No need to use italic for species as the database does not recognise it

The cultivar name is to be in single quotes and is always capitalized. e.g. 'Best Orchid'. Do not use double quotes " "

Do not put any awards the plant may have after the name e.g. FCC/AOC

First Club Awards

A snipit taken from the 1980 Conference booklet



The Society had to wait until September 1974 to have an orchid awarded by the Queensland Orchid Society. This fine specimen of Coelogyne cristata var. "Allison", was awarded a Cultural Award and was grown by Alex Allison.

The next award was in June 1980 to Pete and Cam Basey for the Award of Distinction granted to their orchid Dendrobium (taurus x Amber Glow) "Royal Purple" for its distinctive purple-violet colour.

This was followed in August 1980 when Bill Brown received an award of a Highly Commended Certificate for his plant Dendrobium Kur-Ring-Gai "Ann Brown". The points score was 79.3, only .7 points short of the high Award of Merit.

The latest award was to Cym. Tina Marquand "Jennifer" which was a Highly Commended Certificate awarded by the N.S.W. Orchid Society.

This orchid originated from a seedling purchased by Nev Douglas and flowered about 5 years ago. Bert Swartz liked the flower and took a piece back to Sydney and this season's flowering gained the award.

Also please don't forget to bring in your ferns and other foliage type plants to table at the meetings as well as orchids.

Know that everything is in perfect order whether you understand it or not.
